100th Anniversary Committee

Kapuskasing turns 100 years old in April 2021. Council will establish a Committee to start the planning process to highlight and celebrate this milestone. Council will establish the terms of reference for this committee in January 2019.

Accessibility Advisory Committee is comprised of eight members, seven citizens and one Councillor. The Committee meets 10 times per year. The Committee is responsible to prepare an annual accessibility plan as mandated by the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, 2001 (AODA). The Committee is committed to improve opportunities for people with disabilities, accessibility planning, identify barriers and to provide for involvement in the identification, removal and prevention of barriers to enable full participation. The resource staff person is Melanie Fortier.

Beautification Committee

The role of the Beautification Committee is to make recommendations for the development and implementation of strategies and plans for community beautification initiatives. The Beautification Committee aims to showcase community pride through ongoing initiatives fueled by public engagement and business sponsorships. The Committee will focus on first impressions whether it be for tourists, new residents and new businesses that are either considering to establish or simply visiting. The Committee will be comprised of two members of Council, 2 to 4 members of the public, one staff resource person while establishing partnerships with the Kapuskasing Horticultural Society, Green TK, service clubs and businesses. The resource staff person is Marc Clavelle.

Kapuskasing and District Planning Board is comprised of seven members, two Councillors, four citizen members and one provincial appointee. The Board meets four times per year. The Board is responsible to advise Council on planning matters such as official plan and zoning by-law amendments. The Board resource staff person is Jon Beadow.

Kapuskasing Municipal Non-Profit Housing Corporation is administered by the Housing Services department of the Cochrane District Social Services Administration Board and is comprised of seven members, six citizens and one Councillor. The Corporation meets 10 times per year. The Corporation oversees the Grandvue Seniors Building at 32 McPherson Avenue.

Kapuskasing Police Services Board is comprised of five members, Mayor, one Councillor, two appointed by the Province and one citizen. The municipality has a policing services contract with the Ontario Provincial Police and the 2018 budget is \$1,987,841. The resource persons are Guylain Baril, Pat Kennedy and Chantal Guillemette.

Kapuskasing Public Library Board Council has agreed that the composition of the Board be reduced to five members, three citizens and two Councillors. The Board meets 10 times per year. The Library mission statement is to provide a comfortable and enjoyable learning atmosphere for all members of the Kapuskasing community. The municipality contributed \$145,000 to the Library operations, pays the cost of liability insurance, building maintenance and utilities which amount of \$28,000.

Lumberjack Heritage Festival des bûcherons Committee is comprised of two Councillors and 10 members. The Committee meets six (6) times per year to plan the annual Lumberjack Festival which is held the last full weekend in July.

North Centennial Manor Inc. Board of Directors is comprised of seven (7) directors, Mayor, one Councillor, one director from the East, one director from the West, one director from Kapuskasing and two directors at large. The Board meets 10 times per year. The Town's financial contribution for operations is \$314,000. The resource staff person is Nathalie Mallette.

Senior's Advisory Committee

The advisory committee will provide recommendations and advice to Council on matters which have a direct or indirect impact on seniors in the community. The committee will be responsible for matters such as helping to identify needs of seniors, potential opportunities on initiatives and/or projects to promote healthy senior lifestyle, identify barriers and overcome barriers for seniors, promote awareness and education, support partnerships and funding opportunities. The committee is to be comprised of two members of Council, 2 to 4 members representing seniors and one staff resource person.

Youth Advisory Committee

The advisory committee will provide recommendations and advice to Council on matters which have a direct or indirect impact on youth in the community. The committee will be responsible for matters such as helping to identify needs of youth, potential opportunities on initiatives and/or projects to promote youth engagement, identify barriers and overcome barriers for youth, support partnerships and funding opportunities. The committee is to be comprised of two members of Council, 2 to 4 members representing youth from each high school and one staff resource person.
